Optional Reading Task: Level 2 Cyclones

Cyclones

Tropical cyclones are severe storms. When they hit Western Australia, they have usually formed in the Indian Ocean. They move in a clockwise direction around a calm centre called the eye. Cyclone wind speeds can be up to 400 kms per hour.

Weather forecasters watch a cyclone's path over time and predict where it is going. If a cyclone heads for a town or city, then the Weather Bureau can warn people to evacuate.

3. What does the Weather Bureau do, when a cyclone heads for a populated area?



Optional Reading Task: Level 2 Pancakes

CITRUS PANCAKES

- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1 egg
- 1 whole orange
- Extra strips of orange & lemon peel



1. Mix the flour, milk and egg until a nice smooth batter forms. Add the zest of one whole orange to the mixture. Mix well.
2. Drop large spoonfuls onto a non-stick fry pan, over medium-low heat.
3. Cook for 2 to 3 minutes or until it bubbles, before you flip over.
4. Serve with citrus flavoured maple syrup, by soaking the extra strips of peel in 1 cup of maple syrup ... Yummy!
